## IN SEARCH

A question common to the thinking of many a club president is this: When this year is done, what permanent contribution will our club have made to the betterment of our community and its citizens? Like every president these are my sentiments too.

In thinking about our club program for the months ahead, I have become increasingly aware of a growing need for leadership in natural history education. All around us we see the formation of clubs for hiking, camping, photography, and other related fields, and yet no-where in our community do we find a single club providing dynamic leadership in the area of wildlife recognition and conservation. I believe that this is the role that our own naturalist club should fill in this community.

Wildlife conservation is of more importance in our area than perhaps in many others because, here in the Peninsula, cities and towns are growing rapidly, and lands suitable for wildlife communities are being quickly absorbed by homes and stores. Since the lands along the escarpment are ideal for many kinds of wildlife areas, it is my belief, that our club should provide leadership that would strongly encourage local, provincial, and federal governments to seriously consider the formation of the escarpment area as a provincial or federal park.

Hand in hand with the growing need of the conservation of our wildlife areas, we have the pressing problem of educating our people to enjoy - not destroy - those things we have endeavored to preserve. Our approach to this problem, I believe should be two-fold. Firstly, every effort should be made to create within our adult population a feeling of enjoyment and "at-homeness" in the out-of-doors. To accomplish this the individual will need to recognize our wildlife, and appreciate the delicate balance that exists between one living thing and another. As a step toward this goal, our club could perhaps sponsor a series of Audubon Screen Tours, or a series of Club Sponsored Programs in which leading conservationists and naturalists would be invited to participate.

Secondly, immediate efforts should be made to provide our children with opportunities to go "adventuring in nature". A program like this might include such things as monthly Saturday outings, regular monthly meetings conducted by the young people under an adult sponsor, club sponsored activities that would encourage the young people to take an active part in conserving our wildlife resources.

As a club member, will you give your active, and enthusiastic support to these and other club activities during the year 1964?

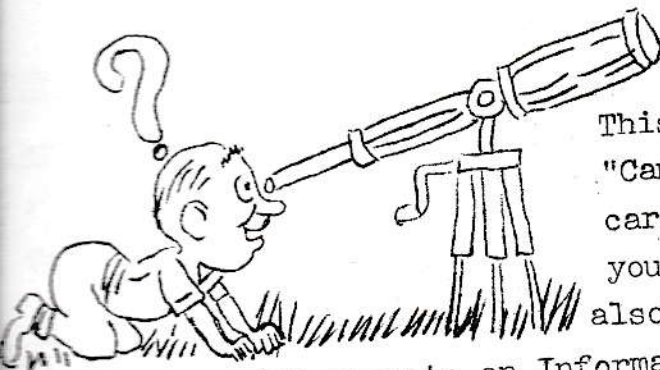

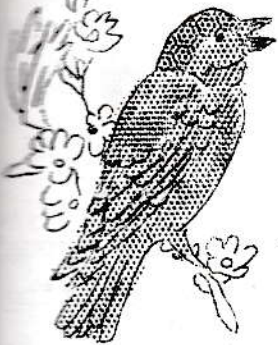
## CHANGES IN THE BIRD-LIFE OF THE NIAGARA PENINSULA

The years since 1920 have seen several striking changes in the bird-life of the Niagara Peninsula. Some kinds that were once only stragglers, are now familiar birds while a few that were common at that time, have become very scarce. No doubt there have been less noticeable changes in the abundance of many other birds, but it is often difficult to tell, how real these lesser changes are, especially when we must depend on memory. When I was a boy, on a farm in North Grimsby Township, I heard many Whip-poor-wills every year, and I thought they spent the summer here. Now I am not sure; perhaps I heard only the spring migrants. Anyway I have not heard or seen a Whip-poor-will in June, July or August since I began to take a more active interest in birds.

The most deplorable change is the decrease of the Bluebird. Only those who remember it during the twenties can realize how common it once was. By 1930 it had decreased considerably, coincident with the increase of the Starling, and by 1935 it was probably less than one-tenth as abundant in the Peninsula as it was fifteen years earlier. For a long time it persisted without much change; then after the very severe winter of 1957-58 in its winter quarters in the southern states its numbers fell to a new low. This was by no means the first such disaster. Edward H. Forbush said it became very scarce in New England after heavy winter mortality in 1895 but it recovered in a few years. At that time it did not have to compete with the Starling.



Those who have known the Bluebird only for the past twenty-five years or so may think that its' favourite nesting site is an open cavity in the top of a post. Some have always nested in such places, but in pre-starling days a much larger proportion nested in old Flicker holes or other deep protected cavities in trees. Now these better places are occupied by Starlings, leaving the Bluebird only the poorer, exposed sites.

The Red-headed Woodpecker is another of our most beautiful birds, whose decline paralleled that of the Bluebird. In the early twenties it was a common bird throughout the Peninsula, often nesting in road-side trees, and cherry-growers sometimes complained of its depredation.



Now it is scarce, though scattered pairs may summer anywhere in the district and if you know its calls you can find it many of the larger woods south of the Escarpment. The numbers I see vary from year to year but its abundance does not seem to have changed appreciably over the past thirty years.

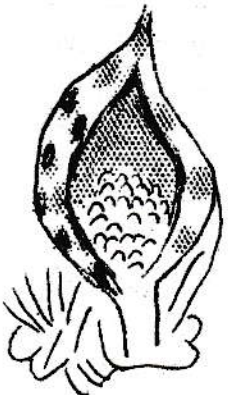
It has been suggested that cutting of oak woods was responsible for its decline, for acorns are one of its chief foods, especially in winter. But I doubt if this was of much importance in the Peninsula where the Woodpecker is mainly a summer resident. It was once common here in districts with few or no oaks, and it has become scarce in these larger parts of southwestern Lincoln where oaks are still abundant. Another suggested cause of its decline is killing by automobiles. This too does not seem very plausible. The Red-headed Woodpecker began to decrease while auto traffic in the districts was still light, and the number hit by model T's moving slowly over rutty roads, could not have been very great.

### SPRING WILD FLOWERS

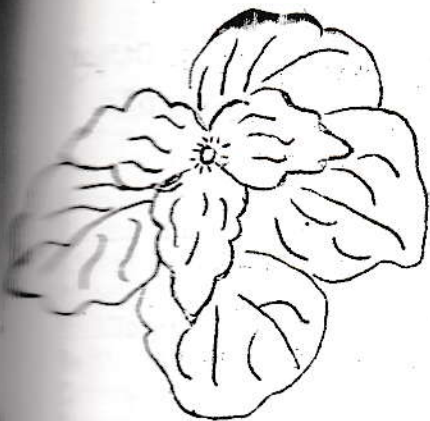

The study and observation of wild flowers is a rewarding way to spend many pleasant hours and exciting moments if one will give some serious thought to this phase of nature. Pleasant indeed! to stroll quietly through the woods, and exciting, yes! to find a rare plant, stimulating a beginner's interest even more.



A novice will place all wild flowers in the same category until his or her curiosity is aroused to separate the species one from the other. To learn why, where and how they grow are the magical words that open a door revealing the many characteristics of these wildlings and why they flourish.

Why not start this spring to learn the proper names and how to identify 10 wild flowers? Also, more about the soil and location where you would most likely find them. If you are starting from scratch this won't be so simple. If you are familiar with the common varieties, why not add to your knowledge and study the difficult or more rare species that we occasionally find in our area.



Don't expect to see all the wild flowers in one month or even the first year. From mid-March when the Skunk Cabbage blooms until late October one must go out at two weeks intervals to see a fair number of some 150 species that grow close to home.

Niagara Glen, is one of our favourite haunts during the spring months. Toward the end of April (earlier if the weather has been warm) the flats of

the gorge have a changing carpet of; Spring Beauty, Trout Lily, Lavender Bittercress, Bloodroot, Toothwort, (2 species) and Wild Ginger. Some of these will still be in bloom when the Trilliums start to bloom the second week of May. A great show of white Trillium can be seen along the pathway at the edge of the river walking downstream. The red Trillium will have bloomed earlier, so it will be past its peak when you see *T. grandiflorum* at its best. If one keeps on walking to the end of the pathway great masses of Blue Cohosh can be seen at ones left. Back behind the Cohosh, giant size specimen of Jack-in-the-pulpit thrive in the wet soil that these wild flowers like well. Walking back, at about this distance from the pathway, one soon comes to large boulders, with Squirrel Corn nestled in every crevice that is deep enough to hold a few seeds each year. Here and there patches of foamflower hug the ground with white Strawberry interspersed along the way. In June return again, following the pathway near the river upstream, and see the rock formations covered with bright red clumps of Columbine.



Ball's Falls Gorge, is another natural setting for most of the foregoing wild flowers including; Merrybells, Mitréwort, Hepaticas, also a stand of Virginia Bluebells. Here, one just might come across a green striped Trillium, these are not too common.

Beamer's Falls, Grimsby, is a delightful place to see a panoramic view of the Town below, with Lake Ontario in the background. Down in the gorge in late April there is an abundance of Hepaticas, Toothwort, Trilliums, Bloodroot and Dutchman's Brecches.



The Stamford Fireman's Park just off Mountain Road at the Q.E. Hwy. is a good place to combine a nature walk with a picnic. At the far end of the pond Marsh Marigolds are to be seen. Along the several wide pathways masses of Trillium bloom in May and later

the Dogwood trees form a canopy of bloom overhead. Other common wild flowers line the paths, with the May-apple growing in good sized stands.

At Dufferin Island, on the Niagara Parkway, it is worth a trip to see the rare Butterbur blooming in early April, some healthy plants of the Skunk Cabbage can still be seen if the Spring is a cool one.

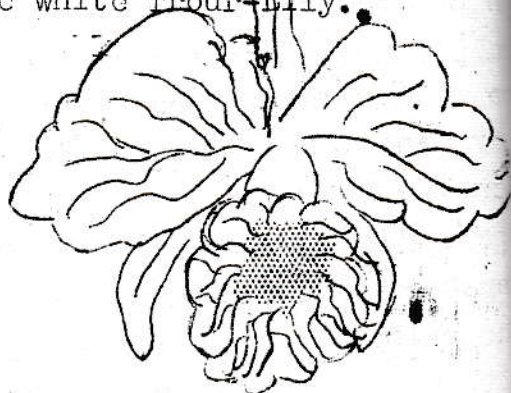
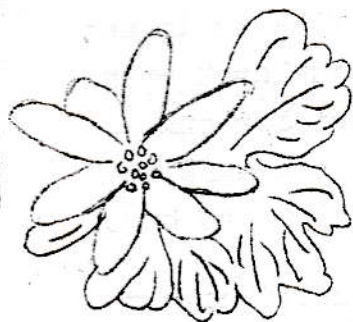
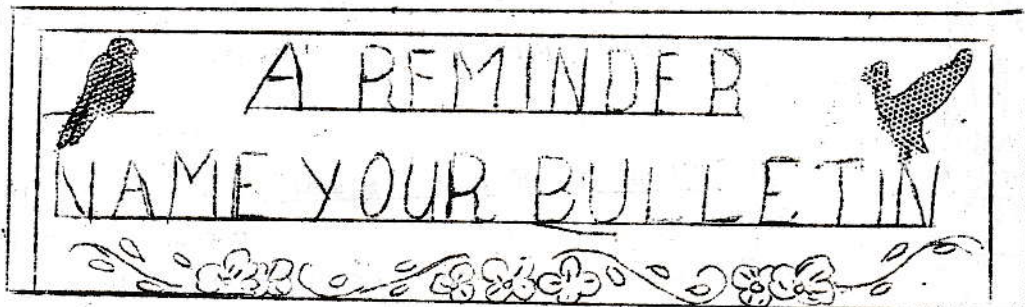
Rockway, still has many wild flowers that are better seen during the week than on a busy weekend. One has to go slowly and look closely, if there is to be anything gained from a nature walk. Rockway is still a beautiful spot, but a busy one on special days.

Getting into June, this is the month the lovely wild orchids are to be seen, if you can find them. Most of them grow on private bush-land near Pelham, in this part of the Niagara Peninsula. Near Tintern there is a marvelous sight of Virginia Bluebells to be viewed each spring and nearby, a pasture teeming with yellow and the rare white Trout-Lily. Arrow-head and Pickeral Weed can be found in many small streams, while driving on the back-roads during July and August, at which time you are searching for the sun-loving flowers.

Botanical names have been omitted due to lack of space and for that same reason mention of many, many more species. During the next few months, if you do find a rare plant or two, I know your adventure with wild flowers will be a completely satisfying one.

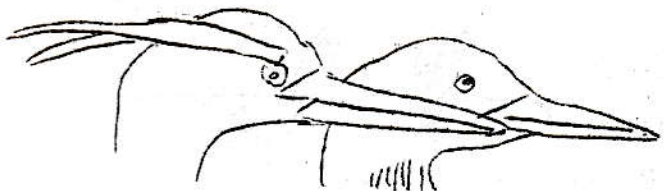

THE 1963 BIRD LIST  
by Mr. Lancaster

There were 241 species reported in the Peninsula during 1963, plus two sub-species. Those species seen in our area by members of the Buffalo Ornithological Society and reported in their publication, "The Prothonotary", are marked B.O.S. These records are included due to the extensive coverage given our area by that organization. Where a B.O.S. is the first for the year the earliest date recorded, by a Peninsula Field-Naturalist (P.F.N.), follows. On migrants, the last spring (LS), the first fall (FF), and last fall (LF) dates are given wherever available. When all records are shown for some of the less common and more interesting species they are marked with an asterisk. When only two dates are shown without other data they are the first and last for the year.
